In view of the national wage requirements, which affect only interstate commerce, the unwillingness of the North Cardina General Assembly to adopt a minimum wage level for purely intrastate con-

cerns opens the door for still further Federal encroachment.

The House of Representatives did pass a minimum wage bill, true; but it first exempted workers in wholesale and retail stores, laundries and dry cleaning plants, tobacco redrying and stemming plants and warehouses, farm workers, domestic help, florist workers, and employees in all businesses with Jess than three workers.

The bill under question would provide a minimum wage of 40 cents an hour for women, and would require time and a half overtime pay for more than 40 hours of work a week.
