

CREW MARKING TO SURE RECOVERED

Hope Still Held For Little Girl Drilling Stopped At 75 Feet

By GRAHAM BERRY SAN MARINO, Calif.—(AP)—A fresh crew of miners was sent 75 feet below the surface of a vacant lot today to bore from a rescue shaft to the fourteenth abandoned well casing in which three-year-old Kathy Fiscus has been trapped since 4:45 o'clock yesterday afternoon.

"I hoped there is a chance that Kathy is alive," said Pier Chief Jimmy Bolt of Pasadena. "Our rescue crew has been working ever since the casing since 5:30 o'clock yesterday afternoon. We know Kathy was alive at 5:30 because she answered her mother's calls an hour after that. At least she hasn't died of asphyxiation."

"The rescue workers soon expect to know whether they have passed right on Kathy's location in the second pipe which was sunk twenty years ago by Kathy's father, when H. F. Fiscus was district superintendent of the California Water & Telephone Co.
