IT APPEARS that we have come to the critical stage in the life of the European Recovery Program. The American people have embraced the principle, and both houses of Congress have agreed, by overwhelming vote, that it should be extended. The big question at the moment is: How much shall we spend on ECA in the next fiscal year?

Administrator Hoffman, by all indica-tions one of the most capable men, the Government has ever been able to lure from private industry, contends that a bigger reduction now will actually be a waste of money, pointing out that at the

present rate of recovery, the original four-year Marshall Plan will cost some \$4 billion less than the original estimate of \$17 bil-lion. If we wreck it now, we may have to continue the aid longer.

Mr. Hoffman is not the kind of man who talks through his hat. He is a hard-headed executive who knows the value of a good investment. Having worked closely with ECA and having watched its good results, Mr. Hoffman's views probably bear more weight with the American people than those of Senator McKellar.
