WASHINGTON (AP)—Veterans Administrator Carl R. Gray Jr. today authorized payment next year of a special \$2,800,000,000 dividend on National Service Life Insurance policies.

Dean James M. Godard will resign his position as dean of Queens College and professor of education in the late summer to become executive secretary of the Commission on Institutions of Higher Education of the Southern Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.
