### NO TIME TO BACKTRACK

A LTHOUGH the Big Four conference in Paris lacked the fireworks that have enlivened such meetings in the past, the

Secretary Acheson made that plain in a report to the Senate Foreign Relations Committee within hours after returning from the French capital.

from the French capital.

Mr. Acheson emphasized that while there was some progress at Paris, the situation continges such that it is imperative for the United States to ratify the Atlantic Pact. And to implement the Pact by adoption of the arms assistance program to fortify our European allies for resistance to continuing threats from behind the Iron Curtain.

Urging a firm policy in Europe to "main-tin the momentum which has been stimslated by that policy" the Secretary said:

". Although some worthwhile progress was made at Paris in reaching agreement on a modus vivend for Germany, and on the principal points of difference on the Austria peace treaty, the failure of the conference to obtain satisfactory and firm agreement on

the economic and political unification of Germany illustrates the still widely divergent views on basic issues between the Sovie Union and re-complasties the utmost impor-tance of ratification of the North Atlanti Pact and passage of the military assistance program at this session of Congress."

Counier drives by the Western democracies to stem the tide of Communist enactes of the Marshall Plant, the Atlantic Pact (still lacking formal U. S. ratification), aid to Greece and Turkey have served to stiffen the backbone of nations menaced by Russia.

He has made a strong case for firm action and has charded a course that appears to offer the best hope of maintaining world peace. publication of confeasions in pending criminal cases. Rule 904, which became known.

In a 5-to-1 decision the Maryland Court
of Appeals has struck out the key sections
of the Baltimore court's rules restricting
publication of crime news, and reversed the
April convictions. "Trials cannot be held in
a vacuum." Judge William L. Henderson
declared in delivering the majority opinion
of the court. "If a mere disclosure of the
general nature of the evidence selled on
