The President's reminder that the danger of aggression still exists is made against a background of gradually increasing self-confidence among the nations of Western Europe. The Kremlin is not the terror it was two years ago, largely because the U. S. has shown its determination to resist any further Red expansion in Europe. But the Red threat is still ever-present, and we must not forget that in a period of relative inaction.

But even if we are unable to find satisfactory answers to these questions, the greater weight of evidence appears to support the arms-aid appropriation. Two sentences, one from the State Department's booklet supporting the appropriation and the other from President Truman's message, express the other view well.
