Red Ouster Effort Hit In Debate Soviet Loses Move To Delay Issue

NEW YORK —(AP) —The United States, urging that Trygve Lie be continued as U. N. Secretary General, appealed to the General Assembly today to override Russian efforts to oust him.

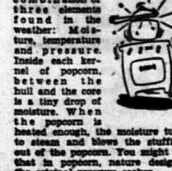

Chinese Red Drive On Hamhung Stalled

SEOUL (Wednesday) —(AP) —Two fast-moving U. S. columns crushed through North Korea defenses at widely separated points Tuesday in a concerted effort to reach the Manchurian border sometime today.
