MANCHURIAN TRAFFIC SAID TO BE HEAVY

Manchurian Traffic Said To Be Heavy
Ground Forces Of UN Push On

SEUL, (AP)—Six hundred Allied warplanes blasted North Korea all along the Manchurian border today to block off Red reinforcements from Communist China.

But air observers reported very heavy traffic crossing Manchuria toward the Yalu River boundary. They also spotted an estimated 50,000 vehicles south of the river in North Korea.

As the U. S. air arm mounted one of the heaviest raids of the Korean war, reinforcements arrived on the Korean east coast. Elements of the U. S. Tenth Air Division landed at the port of Wonsan.

On the ground, U. N. troops pushed forward in the Manchurian border. Communist withdrawal continued.

STILL GOVERNOR
Dewey Wins 3rd Term In N. Y.

NEW YORK (AP)—Gov. Thomas E. Dewey won his third term in office today in a smashing election victory that re-established him as a powerful force in the New York State political scene.

More than 5,200,000 persons voted in the election for Dewey, a record for an election in a non-presidential year. There were 4,443,512 registered and eligible voters.

Dewey defeated Rep. Walter A. Lynch, a Democrat, by a plurality of about 200,000 votes. With 4,408,000 of 9,706 districts in the state, Dewey had 2,797,225 votes to Lynch's 1,610,775.
