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U.S. Firepower Continues To Hold Off Red Forces

THUNDERJET OFF LIKE LIGHTNING

Shrinking Beachhead Lines Infact Heavy Casualties Inflicted On foe

TOKYO.—(AP)—United Nations naval air and ground firepower today held off persisting Red attacks on the Allied Hungnam port beachhead in northeast Korea.

Washington from states countries slammed as 37 concentrations of Chinese and North Korean Communist assault against the 10-mile-long Allied defensive strip.

At no point on the winding defense and around Hungnam port did the Allied forces suffer any consequences in North Korea—were the Reds able to break through.
