Those in the center argue that persons with a sufficient amount of money can easily find a surgeon to perform a steril-ization for contraceptive convenience un-der the therapeutic label; thus, making the operation legal would only make the law comply with reality. They argue, teo, that the sterilization of economically handicapped families should be made available through welfare departments. Certainly there is much to be said for these views. Even a nodding acquaintance with the welfare department is sufficient to convince one that recurring childbirth in economically handicapped families is a tremendous problem.
