### Washington 'Skins Sign Charlie Justice'

CHAPEL HILL, N. C.—Charlie Justice (Choo-Choo) Justice, North Carolina's All-American football star, today cast his lot with the professional Washington Redskins.

Justice, whose kicking, punting and passing kept the Tar Heels in the national football spotlight for the last four years, will leave tomorrow for Washington.

Justice made this statement: "It is the hardest decision I have ever made in my life. My previous decisions not to play professional football were made in good faith and were based on my honest conviction at the time. I realize I have appeared to be wishy-washy, but the truth is that since my negotiating a second year All-American salary a week ago there have been enough developments which have been so attractive that I didn't feel I could afford to turn my back on them."

Justice, who made the All-American football teams in 1949 and 1950, was one of the 11th All-American players ever produced in the Southern Conference. He was selected to the team of the Navy, he was placed on the third All-American team, and as a sophomore he was named All-American player.
