Private funeral services were being conducted here for Curtis B. Johnson, 54, publisher of The Charlotte Observer since 1916.

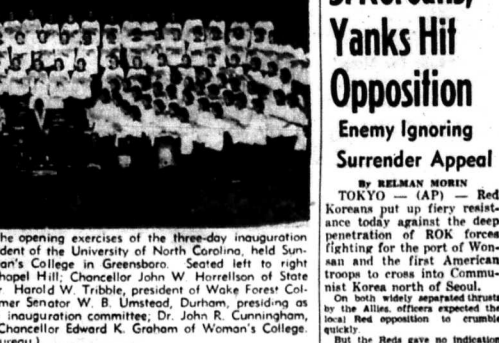
Yale Psychiatrist Slain, Wife Hurt
