A TRAGIC JUDICIAL ERROR

THIS trial and execution of Emmett Till, a Negro, related in Noel Yancey's AP story yesterday, is one of the strangest chapters in the history of North Carolina justice. If the facts are all there and in the right order, it is also one of the darkest chapters.

Governor was found guilty of first degree murder by a Marion County Court on March 16, 1950. Now Mr. Yancey reveals that it was all a mistake.

Emmett Till's lawyer wasn't supposed to die. Judge Luther H. Hattaway said the reason he had agreed to go to the jury on the question of first degree murder was in the hope that it would have a "whole-some effect" on the community, where there had been a long series of killings and aggravated assaults. The judge felt sure that the Governor would commute the sentence if the trial judge recommended mercy.

Something went awry. Judge Hamilton first wrote Parole Commissioner Hathaway Cross recommending that the sentence be changed to a 30-year term for second-degree murder. He wrote:

"I am not at all satisfied with this in case sufficient evidence of malice, intent and deliberation to justify a first degree verdict."

The case went to the Supreme Court which heard only the record proper and not the testimony and the judge's charge to the jury. There were scores of other petitions.

Mr. Yancey's otherwise complete account did not cite the reason why Governor Scott failed to heed Judge Hamilton's recommendation. That it seems to us, is an important detail and should be made part of the record. But more important is the fact that a Superior Court judge should have a life to teach a community a lesson. Certainly, he was expected to enforce the law of punishment to the limit, but it is unthinkable that a defendant should be given a sentence more severe than he merits as an object lesson.

In this case a man went to his death through a tragic mistake. It is too late to correct that mistake. But it is not too late to make sure that it never happens again in North Carolina.

Twenty-eight states will have one party delegations. Twelve of these will send only Republicans to the House: Delaware, Idaho, Iowa, Kansas, Maine, Nebraska, New Hampshire, North Dakota, Oregon, South Dakota, Vermont and Wyoming.

After all, the speed limit for passenger cars is 10 miles an hour more than that for trucks; and the way the latter disregard it is one of the major complaints which is building up opposition for the truck operators when they sit down on public opinion and the 1951 General Assembly.

If the invention of this Charlotte man is put on one end of a trailer-truck hadn't a governor better be put on the other? Meanwhile what's supposed to happen to trucks which go sipping along beyond their 45-miles-an-hour limit on experimental or any other kind of trip which has them on the highways?

Smith May Take Oath Monday

EVERY ITALIAN Senator in office has sworn in as junior Senator from North Carolina when Congress reconvenes Monday, he will still be available, going through the motions from Frank Graham's old office.

Dulles Leads U.S. Efforts To Keep Chinese Reds Cool

THE GREAT Chinese puzzle has baffled many people in Washington since it was first presented in a very long time. Even the most competent experts in and outside the government have been unable to solve the enigma of the behavior of the Chinese Communists.

Now, however, the best informed belief is that negotiations at second or third hand can be carried on in secret with the Chinese Communists, easing somewhat the tension under which top officials of both countries have been living for the past two weeks.

WITHOLD FIRE
This may or may not have been the reason why Chinese Communists, who have been fire as United Nations forces approached the border. But the fact that there was a Chinese Communist emissary with the Chinese Communists eased somewhat the tension under which top officials of both countries have been living for the past two weeks.

In all this John Foster Dulles, Republic's adviser to the State Dept., has been the leading part. He came from Lake Success to Washington ten days ago to discuss the Korean situation with President Truman and Secretary of State Dean Acheson.

After preliminary preparation for the discussions with the Chinese Communists delegation to Lake Success, Dulles has taken the leading part. This is the first time he has been in charge of all Asian affairs before the UN. Because of his position he has had a wide influence over American policy in Asia in general.

In rough outline the approach of the Chinese Communists will be as follows. The United States will agree to the formation of a buffer zone along the border. The controversy will come over whether it is to be taken over by the Chinese Communists or the Chinese Nationalists.

China will then withdraw its troops from Korea and the Chinese Communists will be allowed to stay in the area.

CAUTION IMPERATIVE
In this kind of situation reckless and irresponsible statements can do the most damage. Dulles is well aware of this and is trying to talk well to talk about consulting with the political opposition. But on such delicate subjects as this, any negotiations will be extremely difficult.
