After five years of military occupation Washington decided that a peace treaty was overdur. Toward the end of October Mr. Dulles discussed the matter with Mr. Mallis at Liste Success and gave him a confidential memorandum outlining American ideas for a treaty. This included seeking a Big Four agreement on the former Japanese outlying possessions, with the United States keeping a trusteening on Nov. 20, with typical discourtes note and their own sharp reply. In they insisted that, in accordance with the Cairo declaration, Formons and the Psecadores must go to chins timesuring Peiping): in accordance with Talla, Sakhalin and the Kurlies
