WASHINGTON — By a 4 to 3 vote, the Supreme Court today upheld the Government's right to fire without a trial Federal workers suspected of disloyalty.

Hoover Calls For RFC Liquidation

WASHINGTON — Former President Herbert Hoover said today the Reconstruction Finance Corp. (RFC) should be liquidated.

"I believe some facilities for loans in the small business field should be continued under other organizations."

Requirements governing RFC operations have been relaxed since that time, the former President stated.

"As a result," he said, "the institution now undertakes to finance, by so-called loans, almost anything."

"This area of loans in excess of \$100,000 is where the great danger lies," Hoover said.

Hoover submitted a list of loans the RFC has made to hotels, distilleries, brewers, theaters and bowling alleys.

"Another list is made of loans to beauty parlors, pool rooms and a snake farm," he added.
