Enemies wear Main Enemy Defenses Counter-Attacks Hurled By Foe

By WILLIAM C. BARNARD TOKYO (AP)—Allied troops fighting through driving rain toward the main Communist redoubt in North Korea beat off savage Red counter-attacks today.

Artillery thundered over the sound of hand grenades as United Nations forces threw back the three thrusts. Reds attacked all fronts along U.N. spearheads. They fought stubbornly everywhere against the crushing Allied advance.

U.N. officers said the offensive appeared to be reaching the main Red defense line.

On the eastern front Chinese fought from heavily constructed fortifications built by North Koreans in prewar days. Foliage had grown over them in natural camouflage.

Small but sharp battles flared all along the saw-tooth front from newly captured Yonchun in the west to Kamsong in the east.

Allied gains were chipped out slowly in tough, often hand-to-hand fighting.

Specs of infantrymen and armor pushed northward trying to reach and break the Red "iron triangle," tipped by Ch'orwon, Kumhwa and P'yongyang. They were thrashing up from Yongchun, thirty miles below Ch'orwon, from Yongpung and Yongnong near the 38th Parallel; and from Hwachon eighteen miles from Kumhwa.

High Court Upholds Conviction Of 11 Reds

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Supreme Court today upheld the conspiracy conviction of America's eleven top Communists.

Chief Justice Vinson delivered the majority decision which held that the Red leaders "intended to overthrow the Government of the United States as speedily as circumstances would permit."

Two dissent Justices Black and Douglas each wrote dissenting opinions, making the court's vote in the case, 5-2, since Justice Clark had disqualified himself from the case.

The conspirators to organize the Communist Party and to teach and advocate the overthrow of the Government of the United States by force and violence created a "clear and present danger" of an attempt to overthrow the Government by force and violence.

Therefore, the Chief Justice wrote, the case was properly and constitutionally convicted for violation of the Smith Act.

Sen. Butler's Campaign Manager Is Fined \$5,000

BALTIMORE (AP)—Jon M. Jonkel, 35-year-old public relations man from Chicago, was fined \$5,000 today for violating Maryland's election laws as campaign manager for Senator Butler (R-Md.).

Jonkel pleaded guilty to six charges, three identical one for the primary and general elections. They were that he failed to keep required detailed accounts of money handled by him, to report campaign finances properly and on time, and was not a designated political agent and resident of Maryland.
