ROUGH GOING FOR MR. ACHESON

ALTHOUGH Secretary Acheson has made a reasonable defense of his conduct of United States foreign policy it is doubtful that he has substantially changed the opinions of the Senators or the public.

The Secretary had more than a strike against him as he went to bat before the Senate Armed Services and Foreign Relations Committees to answer criticisms by General MacArthur. The defense is seldom as colorful or dramatic as the attack.

Nevertheless Mr. Acheson has told his story well to this point. His answers appear to have been forthright and certainly he has answered those who said that he had no policy about China and the Far East.

He explained that the last year in which America could have changed the policy of events in China was in 1948. Neither the Democratic Administration, the Republican Congress nor the people were ready to pay the price of intervention in the Communist drive for power.

WHAT NOW IN IRAN?

IT is the hope of the Western World, and at the moment not a far-fetched one, that the Iranian crisis will "blow over" as did the Berlin Blockade crisis in 1948.

(1) The Iranian temper or temperament. (2) British willingness to take part in a fair compromise. (3) The action or inaction of the Soviet Republic.

At the moment, the first two factors point to a peaceful settlement in Iran. While the Press (both right and left) and the fanatics (religious and political) in Iran are securing freedom of movement and are failing to assume immediate control of the nationalized Anglo-Iranian Oil Co. fields, Mossadegh seems reluctant to take that irrevocable step.

Of course, compromise will require two parties. Great Britain has made several gestures in the direction of compromise, but they have not been sufficient to generate enthusiasm among the new-born nationalists in Iran.
