COUNCIL FIDDLES WHILE DRIVERS BURN

WE CITE these precedents today to illustrate our bewilderment over the Council's continued reluctance to vole funds for an adequate survey of the City's need for offstreet parking facilities. This week chairman David Craig of the five-man Charlotte Parking Commission renewed his plan for an appropriation of \$3,000 to make such a survey. The Council turned him down. And at least one Councilman indicated that he was against the whole idea of public off-circle parking facilities.

Only one reason has been advanced for delaying a survey. It is said that the City dress not now have borrowing capacity to buy offstreet parking sites, and that a survey would be out of date before it could be used.

That line of reasoning, however, does not sland up under close examination. For one thing, the City's legal borrowing limit will be much higher by the time a thorough survey is completed. For another, the offstreet parking program will not require great expenditures. In the third place, the travel customs and habits of motorists—the heart of any parking survey—don't change overmicht.

It is said that private parking lots vary from year to year, that new ones are opened and old ones are closed, and that an inventory of svalible spaces would have to be repeated each year. Well, the inventory of parking spaces is a minor part of the survey. It could almost be done in one day by one man. And the contention that the private parking facilities change very rapidly

is in itself an admission of the basic weak-nesses of private lots: (1) they do not guar-antee permanence, and (2) they are placed where sites are available, not where they are

Private parking lot operators contend that public offstreet facilities are not needed, that the law of supply and demand will assure the provision of other private facilities as they become needed, that private enterprise can do the job better anyway.

Against that contention is the experience of practically every American city of any size that private facilities have not been the answer: the conclusion based on observation that business is already freeling the uptown that business is already freeling the uptown that business is already freeling the uptown parking; and the certainty that curb preving will have to be banned entirely in the near future, leaving no place for the short-term parker to stop his whiche.

Such a fundamental difference of opinion-cannot be reconciled by the voicing of other opinions. Facts are needed. And the only way to get the facts is to make a through and scientific study of parking needs.

Once the facts are in, the Council can make a final decision on offstreet parking facilities. It may decide they are not needed, in which case it may discharge the commission decide, on the other hand, that offstreet facilities are needed, in which case an intelligent and farsighted program can be put before the people for their approval.
