LEGAL ACCOUNTS SOLD

Boyle-Siskind Deals Described

WASHINGTON (AP)—Max Siskind, Washington lawyer, told Senate investigators today he bought 23 law accounts from William M. Boyle Jr., the Democratic National Chairman, in 1949 for \$150,000, and estimated he fees received \$432,250 in 1949 from them.

Siskind said he would gladly give the names of the clients in private, but did not want them splashed into the headlines. After much sparring, Committee Counsel Francis D. Flanagan finally read into the record, without naming the clients, a list of the 23 cases. This included the nature of each call and "the value," as estimated by Siskind—that is, how much it might bring to the lawyer handling it.

Galup Poll Shows: Mr. Truman's Popularity Crawling Upward

PRINCETON, N. J.—The personal popularity of President Truman, which had slumped all last winter and spring, reaching a new all-time August average has been inching upward during the recent summer months.

The latest Institute survey on the subject shows a total of 31 per cent of the nation's opinion approving of the way Mr. Truman is handling his job as President. Last June, only 24 per cent of all persons interviewed across the country said they approved, 11 per cent disapproved and 15 per cent were undecided.

BRITISH ASK TRUMAN AID IN OIL ROW

Protest to Iran Over Ouster of 300 Technicians
LONDON.—(AP)—Prime Minister Attlee is asking President Truman personally for help in Britain's crucial oil dispute with Iran, informed sources said today. Britain protested in the strongest terms in Tehran earlier today against an Iranian edict ordering some 300 British oil men to quit the world's biggest refinery in Abadan by Oct. 3.

Three Nations Set To Change Treaty

WASHINGTON.—(AP)—The United States, Britain and France today declared their readiness to give Italy a free hand to rearm as an equal partner in the Western alliance against Communism. An extraordinary three-power declaration and an accompanying Italian-American communique said Italy's repeated request for changes in its 1947 peace treaty would get "favorable consideration."

14 Red Jets Hit In Big Battle

U. N. COMMAND HEADQUARTERS, Korea.—(AP)—Allied pilots today destroyed or damaged 14 Communist planes over northwest Korea in history's greatest day of all-jet battles. There were 256 jets in action. The number dwarfed all previous jet actions for a single day.

UN Rejects Immediate Truce Talk Resumption

TOKYO.—(AP)—The United Nations Command today rejected another Communist suggestion that full-dress Korean truce talks be resumed immediately. The Allies insisted that arrangements be made to prevent further interruptions when the meetings are resumed by mutual agreement at 11:30 a. m.

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LONDON.—(AP)—A Buckingham Palace spokesman said tonight the Canadian-American tour of Princess Elizabeth and her husband, the Duke of Edinburgh, has been postponed because of the king's serious illness. In Ottawa, a Canadian Government official said the postponement would be for a minimum of two weeks.

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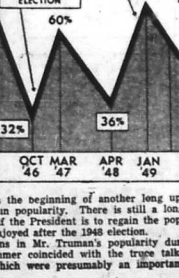
