Check Into Movies News Conclusion WASHINGTON.—The House Un-American Activities Committee today probed into Communist activities within the newspaper business in Los Angeles.

Charles Judson, named in earlier testimony as having attended meetings of Communists within the American Newspaper Guild in 1937 or 1938, was named as a witness (10 A.M. EST).

Charles Daggert, who identified himself as a former newspaperman in Los Angeles and Seattle, testified Monday he attended meetings of eight or nine Communist Party members in the newspaper guild in Los Angeles during the same period.

The committee is investigating a list of activities professional groups in the Los Angeles area. In testimony this week, 28 lawyers earlier, doctors were identified as members of Communist cells in those professions.

'Long Live Russia' Shouts Fill Air

CAIRO, Egypt.—(AP)—Riotous mobs roamed Cairo's streets today, burning and crying for "revenge" against the British. Police said at least eight rioters perished and that scores were wounded as the mobs set fire to more than 25 buildings in the center of Cairo.

The Egyptian cabinet reportedly has decided to sever diplomatic relations with Britain and Britain announced eleven British warships have been dispatched to the Suez Canal to help keep order.

Police fought the angry mobs in Cairo with tear gas, staves and shot fire overhead. The mobs cut hoses of firemen trying to extinguish the many blazes. Chased out by police, the mobs merely moved to other spots and set other fires. The police said most of the dead and injured were casualties of fires and splintered glass from store front windows.

Three Britons were reported killed in an attack on the exclusive British Turf Club in the center of Cairo. Several Englishmen were said to have been inside the club when the mob attacked and it could not be determined immediately whether there were any casualties.

British naval headquarters at Malta disclosed today it sent one cruiser carrier, three cruisers, seven destroyers and a minesweeper steaming swiftly to reinforce the battle-axe canal zone after yesterday's battle between the British troops and Egyptian police.
