Killer Escapes For 6th Time

PHOENIX, Ariz. (AP)—The outlaw again-in-flight trunk murderer, William Keith Judd, led searchers a baffling chase today after her sixth escape from the State Hospital for the Insane. Red-haired, wispy squirmed out through a window windowed screen last night. With her customary craftiness, she left nothing to show just how she circumvented the many precautions taken to keep her in. It was her second escape this year from the hospital where she has been confined since 1933. In 1951 she killed two girl friends and shipped their dismembered bodies to Los Angeles as baggage. She was sentenced to be hanged but was found insane just 72 hours before she was scheduled to go to the gallows. Her flight last night set off a frantic search not only for 49-year-old Winkle but for an unknown accomplice or accomplices.

South Koreans Expect Ike To Drive Red Invaders Out

SEOUL (AP)—Millions of South Koreans seem to think U. S. President Dwight D. Eisenhower will drive the Chinese Communists back into Manchuria. Clarence Rye, official government spokesman, put it this way: "General Eisenhower represents the last great hope of our 22,000,000 people. Ask any man on the street and he will tell you he believes Eisenhower will drive the Chinese Communists out of Korea. So the sentiment of welcome here is a strong and stirring thing."

TACOMA, Wash. (AP)—A four-engined military transport from Alaska crashed in the fog a mile short of its destination here shortly after midnight and 26 of the 39 aboard died in the explosion. The plane was carrying 26 men, 10 women and nine children. The passenger list of servicemen and dependents included seven women and nine children. The only survivors were two women and an eight-year-old boy. Two of the women were killed in the military service. Several of the children were babies.
