Report On Korea Truth About The Air War

(Reprinted From U. S. News & World Report) HERE is what U. S. bombers have done in Korea. North Korea's great power network is virtually paralyzed. The country's railroads are operating at 2 per cent of normal capacity.

Even so, there is no prospect of an enemy collapse at this time—either in the rear of the Communist armies or at the front. Civilians are approaching a state of desperation, but the Communist troops are better fed than before. They were a year ago.

The bombing toll has been drawn together from military reports released to U. S. News & World Report by Gen. Mark Clark's intelligence cover agents, prisoners of war, refugees from aerial observation. They make up the latest military data on the Allied air offensive.

The knockout blows delivered were off limits since the ban was lifted, have created a virtual blackout in North Korea. According to intelligence reports, 50 per cent of all hydroelectric generating plants have been destroyed or at least 20 per cent was out of line in North Korea.
