CASABLANCA, Morocco (AP)—Bloody anti-French rioting erupted in his French North African province today, three Europeans and at least 20 Moroccans were wounded.

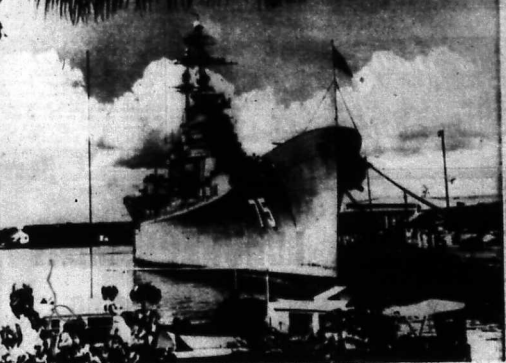
Allied Planes Work Over Red Targets
