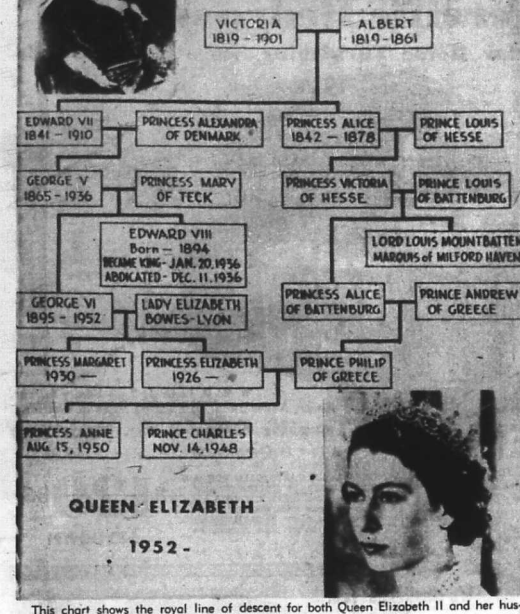

In Prisoner Delivery Rate Reds May Use U. N. System

By ROBERT B. TUCKMAN. KANSAS, Kan.—Allied spokesmen said today the Communists apparently plan to gear delivery of war prisoners to the Allied delivery rate. The U. N. communiqué said there were indications that the Reds "will no longer adhere to their previous offer of completing the return of U. N. prisoners within 30 days after the armistice."

Danger To U. N. Seen In 'Civilian' Air Bases

TOKYO (AP)—Lt. Gen. Otto P. Weyland says if Allied air forces halted the Reds could mount a tremendous jet armada from North Korean airfields within 30 days. The Far East Air Forces commander said in an interview yesterday the Communists have 15 jet airfields which could be put into shape without much engineering effort.
