McGrath-Kefauver Winners in Wisconsin, Nebraska Races

HEADING FOR A SHOWDOWN

Senators Robert A. Taft and Estes Kefauver, scoring heavily in primaries in Wisconsin and Nebraska, opened up big leads today in the race for delegates to the Presidential nominating conventions.

McGrath picked up 28 delegates in Wisconsin. Nebraska's delegates, 18 Republicans and 12 Democrats, were not committed to vote for anyone at the convention.

There was a strong likelihood, though, that at least sixteen of the eighteen GOP delegates would go for Taft at the convention. They had indicated they would abide by the results of the popularity vote.

The division was not clear among the Democrats. Both Kefauver and McGrath seemed likely to get the support of five delegates each. Taft won all 14 large delegates in Wisconsin. His slate won out, 14 to 39 in district races.

COUNCIL GETS PROPOSAL FOR SHARPHIKE

Straight 10-Cent Fare, 2-Zone Plan

Asked By Company By DICK YOUNG Charlotte News Staff Writer

Charlotte Transit Lines Inc., in asking the City Council today for a transfer of Duke Power Co.'s city bus franchise, proposed a hefty increase in fares.

The new company, headed by L. A. Love & Associates, asks for:

1. A straight ten-cent fare. Establishment of two travel zones, with a five-cent additional fare for travel between the two zones.

Two-cent charge for transfers. These requests for fare increases were accompanied by a copy of a franchise to Charlotte Transit Lines to operate buses within the city.

The rate proposals and ordinance, together with a map showing bus routes to be operated by the new company, were delivered to Mayor Shaw and City Manager Henry C. Yancey.

SOFT ROUTE CHANGES A preliminary check indicated no major differences between Duke's present 16 routes and proposed Charlotte Transit Lines routes.

Mr. Yancey ordered a careful check of the map and the changes in the lines shown in color on the map.

The map was to be ready for submission to the City Council this afternoon.

The letter making the request for the bus franchise and setting forth the conditions under which the Charlotte Transit Lines will operate was signed by L. A. Love and J. M. Armes, of Charlotte, designated as two of the incorporators.
