

YUGOSLAVS RIOT AGAINST U. S., BRITAIN

Trieste Withdrawal Decision Touches Off Demonstrations

By ALEX HINGLETON BELGRADE, Yugoslav (AP)—New demonstrations broke out here today against the United States, Great Britain and Italy as President Tito and his Cabinet met to formulate new protests against Italian occupation of the major part of the bitterly-disputed Trieste territory.

Rifle-carrying troops on horseback took to the streets which swarmed in front of the three embassies in angry protest against the British-American announcement yesterday they would withdraw their troops from Trieste port and the surrounding territory and turn it over to the Italians.

The mobs had pelleted property occupied by the three foreign nations with stones until early today, smashing windows and damaging automobiles. No major casualties had been reported.

CABINET CALLED

Tito hastily summoned his Cabinet into emergency session. The government was expected to deliver a strong note of protest to the two Western powers later today.

The government radio said a Yugoslav note already delivered to British and American authorities in Trieste had warned Tito's government would "take all measures of self-defense to protect its interests and the interests of Trieste Slovenes" in the British-American zone.

Reports from Trieste City, the strategic Adriatic port and center of the British-American zone, Yugoslav already had closed the border between the southern half of the territory which they occupy and the northern British-American zone.

RIOT MOVE TROOPS

It was reported here that Tito might rush troop reinforcements to the border in an effort to prevent the British-American withdrawal. Vice President Edward (Karl) already had indicated a Yugoslav appeal to the United Nations.

A dispatch from the Allied half of Trieste said that a riot was heard today from the Yugoslav zone.

The semi-official Yugoslav news agency, Yugopress, reported that demonstrations against the Allied announcement were widespread in the Yugoslav zone of the contested area.

The Foreign Office, meanwhile, apologized to the three Western governments for the violence to their property. A government communication and press organ urged the people to remain calm.
