Jobs, Not Pity, Are What Our Handicapped Need, Meet Told

Instead of feeling sorry for the handicapped child, a nationally known educator said here today, how about letting him get out and find a job?

Dr. Anna M. Engel, retired director of special education in the Detroit, Mich., schools, said there are hundreds of different types of jobs that these youngsters can handle after proper schooling.

Many young people who are terribly crippled for life become expert craftsmen, she said. HOW TO DO IT
We had two children in Detroit who were very badly crippled. But they learned skill craftsmanship. They were married and they opened their own silversmith shop in their basement.

Dr. Engel said that the average child in the mentally-related classes comes out of twelve years of schooling with a fourth grader's capabilities. "There are some jobs in factories that they can do, and do well. There are some routine cleaning jobs they can do. And they are better rehearsed for work, really, than most other children."
