Farm Price Drop Stirs Row

WASHINGTON — A new sag in farm prices—the sixth drop in as many months—added new fuel today to the sizzling dispute between Republicans and Democrats about who is to blame and what to do.

BLAMES DEMOCRATS
Sen. Bridges of New Hampshire, ranking Republican and appropriations committee chairman, started the Senate wrangle by blaming recent Democratic administrations for lower farm prices and income and "unmanageable surpluses."

Democrats to lift the level of government price supports.
"The best informed sources indicate that these (farm) prices are not likely to drop much lower," Bridges said.

Secretary Benson announced several price support moves expected to stabilize the farm price levels. He said the department for another year will continue to support butter and other dairy products at 90 percent of parity.

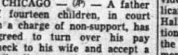
Richard McChrystal, 37, vocational agricultural teacher, was shot to death by a friend after rehearsal for a murder play last night.



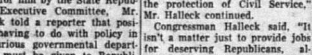
