Disciplinary Action Asked Against Pilot

WASHINGTON (AP)—The United States today demanded that Russia discipline the Soviet jet fighter who attacked a U. S. weather reconnaissance plane last Sunday 25 miles off Kamchatka.

The State Department announced a protest has been delivered to the Moscow Foreign Office by the American Embassy.

The note asks measures to prevent a repetition of such an attack. It also asks for disciplinary action against those responsible for Sunday's incident.

The Air Force announced yesterday that the American B50 bomber, flying out of Alaska, was tracked by two Soviet MIGs and that one Russian plane opened fire on it.

The B50 returned fire and the Soviet plane did not press the attack.

The exchange apparently did no damage to either plane.

The State Department announced the substance of the protest, but the text of the note was not made public for the time being.

The American Embassy at Moscow this morning on instructions from the State Department lodged a vigorous protest with the Soviet Foreign Office against the attack by MIG fighters upon the B50 returned fire in the North Pacific on March 15.

The note sets forth the position of the U. S. plane when attacked about 100 miles south of Petropavlovsk and at least 25 miles from the nearest Soviet territory.

It has been made clear here that the U. S. Air Force will continue to fly its missions despite Russia's challenge to its use of air space over international waters of the North Pacific.
