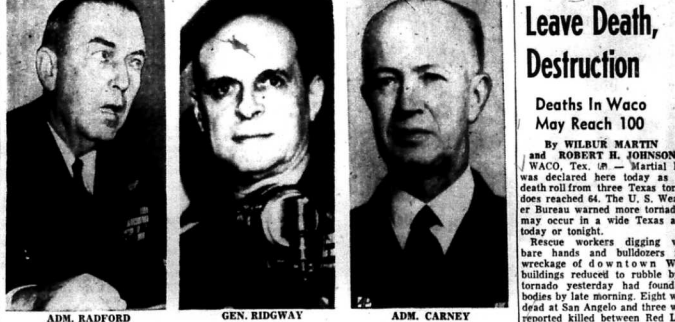
LONDON.—Clement Attlee, opposition leader in the House of Commons, charged today, "There are elements in the United States that do not want a settlement in Korea."
