IMPEACHMENT BILL MERITS SWIFT DEATH

A HOUSE judiciary subcommittee has set a hearing next Tuesday on a resolution to impeach Justice Douglas for "high crimes nearing next Tuesday on a resolution to impeach Justice Douglas for "high crimes and misdemeanors." The first act of the sub-committee, after hearing from Rep. Wheeler who introduced the resolution, should be to kill it quickly and decisively.

The facts are quite clear. Douglas was acting within his statutory hority when he stayed the execution of

the Rosenbergs.

2. He believed that the point of law raised by defense afforneys was substantial enough to warrant further consideration and there is no evidence that he was not sincere. Further, two other justices, Black and Frankfurter, agreed with him.

In his weekly column in yesterday's Nzws,
Rep. Charles Raper Jonas put the issue in
its proper perspective. He said he had
received scores of telegrams and letters
urging him to support the impeachment resolution. And he added:

"While my own personal opinion is that the Justice acted unwisely in the face of

the High Court's most recent decision, nevertheless I do not believe his action meets the high crimes and misdemeanors test for impeachment. I do not see how we can vest a judge with the discretion to do what this one did and undertake to impeach him when he exercises the very discretion he was granted by law."

In defending Justice Douglas' right to stay the execution, while disagreeing with Doug-las' views, Mr. Jonas, an attorney, is upholding a fundamental precept of the bar that was stated so succinctly by the American Bar Association Journal recently:

"We advocates must always remember that our belief is in our system of jus-tice, not in our client's political or per-sonal views. In according able defense and fair trial to every man, we are pre-serving our system of justice."

And as the Christian Science Monitor said recently:

"The defense of liberty, like the defense of free speech, often has to be fought on dubious frontiers in order to preserve and protect the rights of the upright citizen who may be falsely accused."
