Kinsey Reports On New Findings

By ALTON L. BLANKSLAKE Associated Press Science Reporter — BLOOMINGTON, Ind. — The new Kinsey report today finds women stay young longer than men in their activity. Human sex lives, it also finds, are as different as fingerprints. The only basic sex difference between men and women is mental or psychological, the female book says. Most women— with some surprising exceptions — aren't aroused as often as men by sights, talk, or anticipation of sex. Many persons suspected, it finds the roaring '20's really brought a sharp change in American women's sex lives. They changed toward less frigidity in marriage, and more experience and freedom before marriage.

Dr. Alfred C. Kinsey authorized publication today of the scientific findings in his long-awaited second book, "Sexual Behavior in the Human Female." It is more than just statistics or candid confessions of what women do. By comparing men and women, it offers keys for happier marriages and sex laws. Five unusual chapters tell the full science of sex. Some main findings are: One-fourth wives—26 per cent or more—at some time commit adultery, whereas about half of all husbands ultimately have extramarital affairs. Some husbands encourage wives to do so. About half of all women have sex relations before marriage, about half of them just with friends.

Men Grow Old First In Sex Life

Most men reach a peak of activity in their late 20's, the study finds. The male peak is most often far higher than the female peak. Male activity remains higher throughout life than the activity of most females. But the fact is most men are growing old in sexual activity when their wives are becoming more interested and less inhibited in sex. This difference often leads to marital problems. It's still a mystery why men are usually older than their wives in sexual activity.

Of 23 kinds of psychological attitudes toward sex, only three stimulated higher percentages of women than men. These were seeing romantic movies, reading romantic literature, and being hit. Men are usually more aroused by nude pictures, thoughts of sex, or other reminders.

Third of women are not aroused at all by any psychosexual stimuli. But 2 to 3 per cent are far more aroused than any man. Trouble often comes when men expect women to react psychologically as men fail to realize that women are more easily distracted from sex by noises or mental arousal accounts for husbands' wanting more frequent sexual contact, and men's difficulty in getting along without it. Wives often fail to understand that.

The sex response involves 20 bodily or physical changes, including faster pulse, shallow breathing, shortness of oxygen, rapid breathing, lessened ability to see and hear.

Anger involves 14 of these changes. Anger thus equals sex minus six.

This could explain some sex crimes, "why frustrated sexual response too readily turns into anger or rage," or anger can lead to sex. It could explain why marital quarrels sometimes lead to love-making.

Fear contains nine of the sex reactions, and epilepsy produces eight of them.

Basically, there's no difference in the anatomy and physiology of sex response in men and women. The most striking difference is the same.

People at times have tried schemes to abandon the family and home, but "none of these schemes has provided satisfactory substitution for the home, and most of them have been short-lived. History confirms the importance of the family."

At marriage, about one-third women have never had a sexual climax, through any method. But almost 100 per cent of men have.

The woman who experiences a climax before marriage, by any method, has a two to three times better chance of achieving sexual success after marriage. Kinsey says the meaning of this must be studied.

No two persons are exactly alike in their sex lives, men fit entirely into all the averages Kinsey has yet found. Each person can easily believe that what she or he does is normal. This individual variation "is the most realistic reality of sex life."

There are no sexual qualities found in only one sex or the other.

Change In Attitude Traced To The '20's

Women show greater extremes in sex than do men. Women seem to be more liberal, and to hesitate to discuss their sex lives with other women. This lack of comparing notes is often.

Parents in the '20's, the time of the big change, were right in complaining about rigidity of the younger generation. Since then there's been little change, and less criticism from parents because the parents had done the same thing themselves.

The change in the '20's has reduced frigidity in marriage by one-third to one-half what it was among wives born before 1900. There's little correlation between sex hormones and sex activity. The amounts of female or male sex hormones don't explain why males reach an early peak and decline, or why there's no such aging effect in women.

Defenses in amounts of certain adrenal hormones, called 17-ketosteroids, might explain this difference. After castration, many men made eunuchs, and almost all women can still have sex relations.

Females do not develop earlier sexually than males. It is a mystery why adolescent girls are slower than boys to develop in sexual responsiveness. The 17-ketosteroids might be the reason. There is no physical reason why women may be slower than men to reach a sexual climax.

Mossadegh Reported Held By New Regime

Fighting Continues In Iranian Revolt

TEHRAN, Iran — Premier Feroz Khatami's forces today arrested Mohammed Mossadegh and three of his lieutenants in a house in the center of Tehran.

LONDON — The royalist-controlled Tehran radio today announced capture of ousted Premier Mohammed Mossadegh but said new street fighting with Mossadegh's supporters broke out in the capital.

Earlier dispatches from Tehran said the new premier, Maj. Gen. Feroz Khatami had given the widely held Mossadegh 24 hours to surrender.

Late broadcasts from Tehran described his right hand man, former Tehran radio station head, Yusef Mossadegh's capture but gave no details of his capture and how he was being held.

Gen. Zohabi said the Shah had instructed him to prevent Mossadegh from being lynched by the street crowds who had taken to the streets.

"We will wait for the nation to decide what should be done with him," Zohabi said.

A later Tehran radio broadcast said Mossadegh and members of his cabinet were being held in a house in the center of Tehran, where Mossadegh was taken.

Reds Promise To Step Up POW Exchange

150 Scheduled For Freedom On Friday

By WILLIAM J. WAUGH PANMUNJON — The great Korean War prisoner exchange passed the halfway mark today and there was every indication the Reds will send back larger numbers of Americans daily.

They promised 150 tomorrow, the biggest U. S. group yet, and it appeared the stepped-up rate would continue indefinitely. Three hundred South Koreans also will be freed tomorrow.

Some 400 British and 300 Koreans were freed today in the 18th day of exchange at this time.

No British were scheduled to return Friday. The Reds have delivered 809 of the 822 British promised to return to the United States. 1,135 Americans, well under half of the 3,313 they listed.

HALFWAY POINT Thursday's promises brought the number of Allied troops freed to 5,533, just over half of the 12,783 the Reds promised to return.

No Communists were sent north Thursday and no more are scheduled until Saturday. Typhoon conditions disrupted Allied shipping from the Korean island prison camps of southern Korea.

Bomber Falls In Arizona

PIACAZO, Ariz. — A giant B-50 bomber on a training mission was torn apart by a tremendous explosion early today and at least 11 of the 12-man crew parachuted into the Arizona desert.

They came down on the cactus-covered, desert slopes of Lower Pinal County.

There were conflicting reports that one, and then two had been killed.

The Pinal County sheriff's office at Florence, some 25 miles to the north, said the bodies of the air men were badly mangled when they dropped into the rocky desert.

Later it received a second report that the mangled body of another airman had been found in the wreckage.

Russian H-Bomb's Blast Confirmed

WASHINGTON — (AP) — The United States today confirmed Russia's boast of having touched off a hydrogen explosion but implied that this country has a two-year lead in the race to perfect the most awesome weapon known to science.

Whether a fifth country has yet developed a true H-bomb that is a device compact enough to be carried aboard warplanes remains unknown to the public.

The Communist newspaper Pravda said in Moscow late last night "the explosion of a type of hydrogen bomb was carried out with experimental aim."

This prompted Chairman Levin L. Strauss of the Atomic Energy Commission (AEC) to announce early today that (A) U. S. atomic tests in fact exceeded Soviet atomic blast eight days ago and then later determined that conventional A-type reactions were involved and (B) U. S. atomic tests in the Pacific in both 1951 and 1952 involved similar tests.

DELAY NOT EXPLAINED There was no immediate explanation of why the United States would for the Russian to have put out its own announcement.

Pressure has been mounting in Congress and elsewhere for President Eisenhower to tell the world more about the status of the U. S. atomic weapons program.

That pressure is certain to build up even more now.
