IRANIAN REVOLT COULD HELP THE WEST

AS YOU SIT SAFE and comfortable in your A beams tonight, Iran may seem to be a distant, remote place. And what has happened there in the last two or three days may appear to be of no concern to you. But Korea was even more remote in June, 1950. Yet the crossing of the 38th Parallel by armed forces of North Korea threw this nation into a major war and changed the whole trend of world history.

At this stage, however, there is a good deal of satisfaction for the West in the rebellion against Mossadegh. It showed that his grip on Iran was less firm and that the Shah's supporters are stronger and more spirited than had been thought. And it set the stage, at least, for a reorientation of Iranian policy toward the West, after two years in which Mossadegh had studiously built a wall of resentment against the West.

N. C. LAGS AS REGION MOVES AHEAD
