**Reds Asked About  
Van Fleet's Son**

PANUMJONJ, Sunday (U.S. Press)—The United Nations Commission on Human Rights is asking the Communists to account for Capt. James A. Van Fleet, missing flier son of the former 8th Army commander in the belief that the missing B26 bomber pilot is being held with other Americans behind the Bamboo Curtain.  
Young Van Fleet and Capt. Harold Fischer Jr., double jet ace from Sioux City, Iowa, were both named in the latest list of 307 U. S. airmen still unaccounted for after being reportedly captured. The list was released by the Pentagon in Washington Saturday, (U.S. State).  
A Communist spokesman in Panumjonj revealed yesterday that Fischer was being held by the Chinese Communists at a hospital and other fliers on charges of violating Red China's air space over Manchuria.

**3 Gaston Men,

Die In Wilkes**

ELKIN—(U.S. Press)—Four men were killed in the collision of a tractor-trailer and an automobile 12 miles north of Elkton on U. S. Highway 21 in Wilkes County early today.  
The dead, all passengers in the car, were identified as:  
Fred Robert Chestnut, 23, and Max Glenn Burchfield, 18, both of Pinckney Station, Gastonia; Dennis Lafayette Norris, 27, of Clover, S. C.; R. I. and Harry Neal Corn, 26, of Gastonia, R. L. 4.  
The driver of the tractor-trailer was Bobby Gray Bauguess, 22, of North Wilkesboro.  
Neither Bauguess nor Bobby Lee, a Communist, says the House Un-American Activities Committee, even though he registered as one 17 years ago.  
Chestnut and Norris were killed in the collision; Burchfield and Corn died shortly after their arrival at Chatham Memorial Hospital here.  
Officers and ambulance attendants from Elkton worked for more than an hour removing the victims from the wreckage. They used a wrecker to get the car and then rode on top of it down a 20-foot embankment.  
The tractor was completely demolished. Its top was crushed. Bits of wreckage and parts of the motor were scattered along the highway at the scene of the accident.  
Patrolman Castle, who assisted Patrolman W. D. Achledge of North Wilkesboro in the investigation, said the tractor-trailer was southbound on the highway at the time the car, the car was traveling northward.  
Patrolman Castle said Bauguess was unable to give a coherent account of the wreck, saying, "The last thing I remember was seeing the car on the road without any lights."  
Castle said Bauguess has been charged with manslaughter and reckless driving and taken to Wilkesboro to complete arrangements for his bond.

HOLLYWOOD (U.S. Press)—It was the most hectic day of her life for Lucille Ball, but as TV's Lucy, she was never happier.  
The top-ranking comedienne resigned to call off her television show last night although some of her associates urged her to. The show is filmed before a live studio audience for later release.  
Before the show got under way, husband Desi Arnaz addressed the studio audience of 300.  
"I want to talk to you about something serious . . . Lucy has never been a Communist—not now and never will be."  
The audience, composed of fellow workers and outsiders, let loose with a burst of applause that lasted a full minute.  
"I was kicked out of Cuba," Arnaz continued, "because of communism. We despise everything about it. Lucy is as American as Barney Baruch and Eliezer Sigmund."  
By the way, we both voted for Eisenhower—so ladies and gentlemen, don't judge too soon on behalf of yourselves. Read her story. Don't believe every piece of bunk you read in some paper."  
Mrs. Arnaz introduced his wife as "my favorite redhead. That's the only thing red about Lucy and even that is not legitimate."  
The studio audience cheered Lucy as she appeared. They were in the eyes of both Lucy and Desi as they acknowledged the applause.  
As the show progressed, Lucy cavorted as always. Her comedy showed no signs of the stress of the day. A doctor had been in attendance earlier, fearing that she might collapse.  
However, he was not needed. As the show wound up, she addressed the audience simply.  
"God bless you for being so kind."
