M'Carthy Asks Contempt Case

NEW YORK (AP)—Sen. McCarthy (R-N.Y.) said today he would ask for a contempt or perjury citation against a native born American employed by the United Nations and described as a Communist. He said the employe, Julius Reiss, documentation clerk, gave conflicting testimony before the Senate permanent investigations committee which McCarthy heads.

Carthy said, "I'm getting sick of this. You are not going to abuse the privilege to cover up a conspiracy." Another witness, Paul Crouch, had told the subcommittee in his own opinion that he knew Reiss as "Joel Remes," and that Reiss once was organizational secretary of the Communist Party in New Orleans. He described Reiss as "a professional revolutionary of the Communist Party in the 1930's."
