**Heffman**

Heffman told the closed-door session that any program which called for "giving away" something for nothing would "sound bad." The American people, he added, had every right to expect that the money now being "invested" in foreign aid would come back to the United States.

Now, Heffman warned that some nations might not survive to trade with us unless it is in their interest to do so.

"I do not believe that the free world will remain free or continue to gain strength unless the nations we are now helping are able to help themselves," Heffman said.

The Mutual Security Program can be able to get the United States services to the extent of about \$16,000,000.
