Ten Days Allowed For Appeal On Tax Evasion Case

Keith M. Beaty today was sentenced to serve two years in a federal penitentiary and pay fines totaling \$20,000 for income tax evasion.

At that time Judge Warlick continued prayer for judgement until Jan. 29, in effect making last Wednesday a conference of which he would pass sentence.

THREE COUNTS
Judge Warlick also ordered Mr. Beaty to pay a \$10,000 fine for the 1945 count and \$5,000 fine for each of the 1946 and 1947 counts.

APPEAL INDICATED
Judge Warlick indicated they would file an appeal and seek a prison sentence. They were not available for comment afterwards, however, as they left the courtroom to hold a conference.

BEATY SILENT
Mr. Beaty has ten days in which to file an appeal.
Dr. Claude Spurr and Dr. Allyn Chaste made the physical examination of Mr. Beaty. In their report to Judge Warlick they said they were assisted by Dr. John C. Glenn, of Mercy Hospital, who made X-rays and various other tests.
