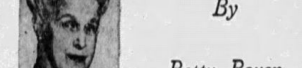

Scalloped Oysters

- 1 cup melted butter
- 2 teaspoons salt
- or margarine
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper
- 1 cup dry bread crumbs
- 2 qts. oysters
- 1 1/2 cups cracker crumbs
- 3/4 cup oyster liquor or cracker meal
- 6 tablespoons light cream

Start your oven at 450 F. or hot. Butter a shallow, 2-quart baking dish. Mix butter or margarine and mix thoroughly with bread crumbs, cracker crumbs, salt and pepper. Drain oysters and save 3/4 cup of the liquor to use later on.

Now put about 1/3 of the crumb mixture in the bottom of the baking dish, cover with half the oysters, oyster liquor and cream. Repeat with remaining ingredients and sprinkle top with crumbs. Bake 30 minutes and serve piping hot to 12.

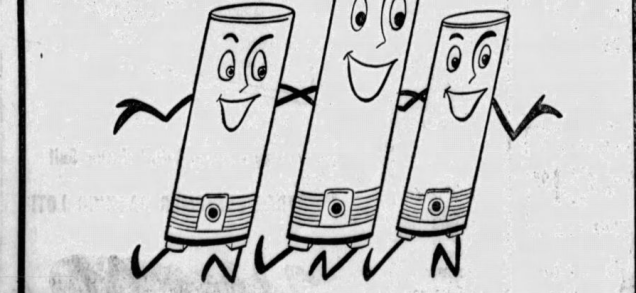
