## Parnell Thomas Loses In N. J. Comeback Bid

NEWARK, N. J., (AP)—Rep. William B. Widnall today hailed his Republican primary election victory over McCarthy booster J. Parnell Thomas as a vote of confidence in President Eisenhower rather than a test of McCarthyism.  
"It was not a true test of McCarthyism," said Widnall, who defeated Thomas by a 35,000 to 5,000 vote in the standout congressional contest of yesterday's primary election in New Jersey.  
"I think the results show that we need more than McCarthy as a platform on which to make a successful run," he said in a victory statement. He said he thought McCarthy's sentiment had fallen off recently.  
Thomas, who had served seven terms in Congress before he was elected in 1948 for payroll padding, had campaigned as a "1,000 per cent" supporter of Sen. Joseph R. McCarthy (R-W.Va.).  
Widnall indicated the record Thomas carried into the election, rather than his support of McCarthy, hurt him at the polls in the state's mostly rural 7th District, traditionally Republican.  
"I campaigned as a supporter of President Eisenhower and I believe the vote reflects confidence in what he has been doing," Widnall said.

New Jersey voters selected Republican and Democratic candidates in the state's 13 other congressional districts and voted on two gannibing referenda.  
All major cities and most of the other 566 municipalities in the state authorized local licensing of bingo and raffles for charitable purposes.  
Democratic contests in five congressional districts and three Republican ones were settled.  
Two incumbents, Rep. Alfred D. Siemsen, a Democrat, and Rep. Frank C. Osmer Jr., a Republican, won re-nomination.  
T. James Tully of Jersey City, a Democrat seeking the seat to be vacated by Rep. Edward J. Hart, won nomination in the heavily Democratic 14th District. Tully is a former state assemblyman and the nephew of the late James Tully, secretary to President Wilson.

Fred E. Shepard of Elizabeth, an ardent supporter of the late Sen. Robert A. Taft of Ohio, appeared to be the victor by 54 votes in the 6th District over Francis V. Lowden, onetime Republican chairman of Union County. The ballots were counted twice and were due for a third count today.  
The GOP nominee will run against Rep. Harrison A. Williams, the first Democrat elected to Congress from the normally Republican sixth.  
Assembly Minority Leader Frank Thompson Jr. of Trenton appeared to have won a three-cornered Democratic race to seek the 4th District seat now held by Rep. Charles R. Howell. Howell is Democratic candidate for the U.S. Senate.  
Both Howell and former Rep. Clifford Case of Rahway, Republican, were unopposed in the primary as candidates for the seat being vacated by Sen. Robert C. Hendrickson.  
Adding attention to the Widnall Thomas contest was the hospitalization of Mrs. Thomas, 52, who, police said, took an overdose of sleeping pills. Mrs. Thomas was reported to be in fair condition at the Bergen Pines Hospital. J. Parnell Jr. said his mother suffered a nervous breakdown.
