U.S. Takes Plane Incident To U.N.

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y. — The United States put its latest cold war brush with Russia before the United Nations today...

Before its delivery, however, the Soviet Foreign Office had handed the U.S. Ambassador Charles E. Bohlen a protest charging that the plane had flown within the Soviet frontiers and opened fire on two Soviet fighters which it approached...

Because Lodge asked for an "early" meeting rather than an "urgent" session, it was expected that Erutia would not call the council to meet before next week...

However, the United States appeared to be seeking time to complete its case against the Russians by still anxious to hit the Soviets in the initial punch should the Kremlin also decide to take the incident to the United Nations...

In a second note rejecting the Russian protest completely, the State Department had said, "At no time did the United States Navy aircraft open fire on the Soviet aircraft."

New Evidence Hinted Against McCarthy

By G. MILTON KELLY WASHINGTON — There were reports from sources close to Sen. McCarthy (R-Wis.) today that he may question whether Sen. Ervin (D-NC) is prejudiced...

This development came as senators weighing censure charges against McCarthy resumed public hearings and passed word their staff has additional evidence to declare he has been told that commentator Walter Winchell mentioned Ervin in a broadcast Sunday night...

I know nothing beyond what Winchell broadcast," he said. McCarthy said the Winchell report "something" from an article published Aug. 1 by The Winston-Salem (N.C.) Sentinel and Journal, quoting remarks attributed to Ervin...

McCarthy himself declined to discuss the Ervin reports except to declare he was not sure if commentator Walter Winchell mentioned Ervin in a broadcast Sunday night...

A check of the file of the newspaper showed that on Aug. 1 it quoted Ervin as saying in an interview: "I'm a lawyer, and as a lawyer I know you can't convict a man on hearsay evidence..."

Ervin denies bias. Reporters asked Ervin about it. He said he knows of no basis for a challenge of his impartiality...

Ervin said he is on record as declaring that "I would not vote to censure anyone except after hearings and due process of law..."

"I am Miss Connecticut," she insisted. "I won the Miss America Pageant contest legally." She refused to relinquish the badge, and Miss Slaughter shrugged and said she could keep it...

Labor Day Road Toll Lowest In Six Years

Accidents during the long Labor Day weekend killed more than 300 Americans but the traffic toll was the smallest in six years. New tabulations today showed that traffic deaths numbered 357, down from 407 in 1948...

The traffic toll was lowest for Labor Day holiday since 1948, when 293 deaths were reported. It fell under the predicted total of 390 although it was somewhat higher than the total for a recent nonholiday weekend...

The overall total was the lowest for the Labor Day period since 1948, when 407 accidental deaths were reported. The holiday period this year began at 6 p.m. Friday and ended at midnight Monday...

Ned H. Dearborn, president of the National Safety Council, termed the national toll "tragically high" but found it "encouraging" because it reflected a downward trend in traffic deaths...

For the second straight holiday the traffic toll was not only well below our preliminary estimates but was the lowest for any three-day period of that holiday since 1948. The Fourth of July traffic toll (348) was the lowest for any three-day period of that holiday since 1949...
