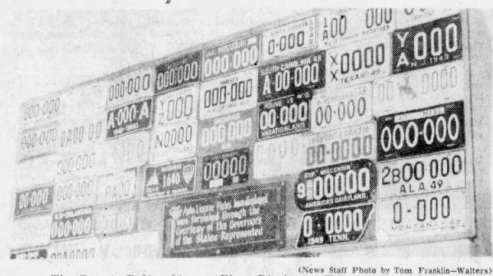

The 1956 license plates of North and South Carolina will be exactly the same color.



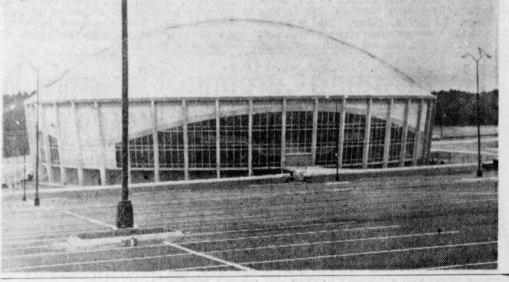
The County Police License Plate Display: Changes Are Afoot.
