

Albany Balks at Truce Price; Negroes Vote to Push Protest

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are not ringing, they understand what you're talking about.

"They also understand the ballot," she added. "After you have registered, if you make up your minds you want to be free, go back and vote."

While the rally was taking place, the city commission was debating in its third session of the day the terms of the Negroes' truce demands.

A majority of the commission reportedly was refusing to agree to allow 11 "freedom riders" arrested last Sunday to be released from jail without posting bond.

The commission was believed to have agreed to other conditions reported to fly a six-man biracial committee formed Thursday in an effort to bring an end to the week-long demonstrations here.

Those conditions included release without bail of some 235 Albany Negroes arrested during the week, desegregation of Albany's bus and train terminals and appointment of a biracial committee to make a long-term study of Negroes' other desegregation demands.

There were no demonstrations Friday, but one incident temporarily upset the uneasy truce in the city. It was reported that

Slater King, one of the leaders of the "Albany Movement" who is serving a five-day contempt of court sentence for demonstrating in front of city hall during a court session, had been shoved into the bars of his jail cell and had suffered head injuries.

Albany Police Chief Laurie Pritchett said Slater King was not seriously hurt and recommended that the jailer involved be dismissed. He was.

Pritchett emphasized that the man was not an Albany police official. He said the incident was "not serious, but it could have been. He's not the kind of man I want around my jail."

When Martin Luther King and the other integration leaders arrived by car from Atlanta, they were given a police escort from the city line to assure their safety.

Fritchett said this far has been able to prevent any incident of violence.

Mayor Asa D. Kelley earlier Friday said Burke Marshall, head of the U.S. Justice Department's Civil Rights Division, had telephoned an offer of legal advice and negotiations. The mayor said he told Marshall the city could handle negotiations on its own.

The 11 freedom riders may have come an issue because many

local whites consider them the source of Albany's week of racial demonstration. The local Albany Herald editorially called the freedom riders troublemakers, and Mayor Kelley has said that race relations in Albany were good until the appearance of the 11 last Sunday.

After being charged on the city offenses, the 11 were bound over to the county misdemeanor court on additional state charges Thursday, with bonds set at \$750-\$1,000.

Ten of the defendants, seven Negroes and three whites, remained in the county jail Friday rather than post bond. The eleventh, a white man, was granted permission by the recorder's court on Wednesday to fly to New York for a speaking engagement.

Meanwhile, nearly two dozen state patrolmen were standing by at city hall in case they were needed, and the local National Guard, whose call up was authorized Thursday by Gov. Vandiver, also remained on standby alert.

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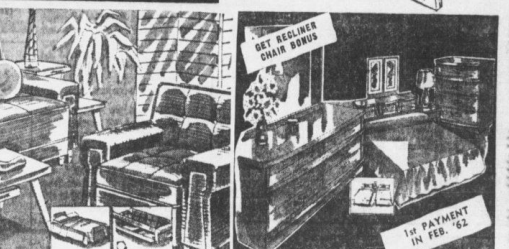
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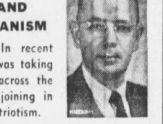
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PICKRICK SAYS

Eichmann Sentenced To Hang

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amed Eichmann immediately after the sentencing reported: "I found the prisoner completely unaffected—his pulse was normal, his breathing steady. There was no agitation."

The crowded courtroom reacted almost as impassively as Eichmann to the sentence. There was no excitement, yet the occasion was not without tension. The sentences were 17 minutes late and during this period everyone, except possibly Eichmann, became increasingly restive.

JUDGES DELAYED
The judges were delayed by last-minute corrections in the written translations of their sentence from Hebrew. As the minutes dragged by, Eichmann sat stiffly in his cage glowering at the empty bench.

Landau told Eichmann he may file an appeal against the verdict and the sentence. Servatius left for West Germany shortly after the session, leaving his assistant Dieter Wechtenburg, to file the appeal notice. Wechtenburg said this would be done Sunday.

Eichmann was condemned for four crimes against the Jewish people, seven crimes against humanity and a war crime. The court said:

"Even if we had found the accused acted out of blind obedience, as he alleges, we would have said that one who had participated in crimes of such dimensions for years on end has to undergo the greatest punishment known to the law and no order given to him could be a ground even for mitigating his punishment."

COURT FINDINGS
"But in fact we have found that in acting as he did, the accused identified himself in his heart with the orders received from him and was actuated by an ardent desire to attain the criminal object."

In dismissing the prosecutor's argument that a death sentence was mandatory, Judge Landau said the measure of punishment in this case was a matter for the discretion of the court.

Hijacker Is Shot in Sea Chase

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Capt. Richard Gledhill and mate Jack Harrington.

Officers said the Negro identified himself as William Stoner, 19, of Mercersburg, Pa. He carried no papers, they said.

Lifted from the San Dona in a basket, Stoner was flown by helicopter to shore for first aid and then taken to Jackson Memorial Hospital. He left the cruiser's deck bloody and one window pierced by a bullet.

Interviewed by ship-to-shore telephone, Gledhill said Stoner told him that he wanted to go to Cuba to kill Prime Minister Castro "because Castro had killed some of his friends."

"The man told us he was originally from Pennsylvania, but didn't like the city," Gledhill said. He added that neither he nor Harrington was hurt, "but he threatened to kill us if we did not cooperate."

Bob Lowenthal, mate of the fisherman Edward H., sounded the alarm. Lowenthal said he saw the hijacker point a pistol at Gledhill and Harrington and told them, "Get going, and I'm not kidding."
