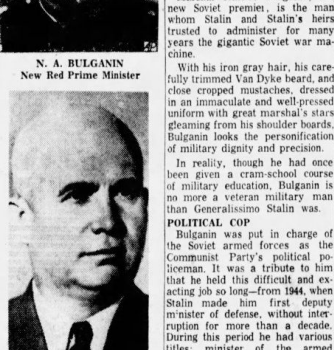
## Tachen Island People Head For Formosa

## Resigned Premier Admits 'Failure'

 MOSCOW (AP)—The Soviet Union boosted its defense minister to the premiership today and spelled out tough foreign policy based on the idea that the United States is preparing for World War III.

The dramatic shift was coupled with a 2½ hour speech by Foreign Minister V. M. Molotov, who declared the United States is guilty in China of an aggression "which must be condemned by the United Nations if the U.N. wants to retain its respect."
