# Industrial Waste: Of Time & The River

THE GREEK philosopher Heracitius preached 2,400 years ago that change is the essence of all things. He nailed down his argument with an epigram: No man can ever step in the same river trice. Time, like the river, is an inclueable dimension within which man moves as on a one-way street.

So much for man's journey through time.

As far as industrial waste is concerned,

million dollars to satisfy the needs of
