## Khrushchev Hints Veto of Atom Checkups

MOSCOW—Premier Nikita S. Khrushchev rejected Friday the Western contention that international inspection is essential to guard against the violation of a nuclear test ban treaty.

In advance of negotiations among the Soviet Union, the United States and Britain scheduled to open in Moscow in mid-July, Khrushchev made it clear that the Soviet position on the inspection issue had hardened.

### OFFER WITHDRAWN?

The Soviet leader implied that Moscow would withdraw its offer to allow from two to three on-site inspections to prevent cheating on an agreement to halt underground testing.

Khrushchev said the President John F. Kennedy speech on testing last Monday had made "a favorable impression." He welcomed the call for better relations between the Soviet Union and the United States.

The Premier said the President had realistically appraised the threat to the world arising from the arms race and the stockpiling of nuclear weapons. Khrushchev agreed with the President that another world war was not inevitable.

However, the Premier was strongly critical of the President's position on the Berlin question, the Western approach to a nuclear test ban treaty, and the presence of U.S. bases around the Soviet Union.

The State department said also that Haiti is recalling its ambassador to the United States, Dr. Louis Mars.

The Haitian action does not mean a break in U.S.-Haitian diplomatic relations—but it marked a further deterioration in Washington-Port-au-Prince relationships already at a low level because of recent events.

In diplomatic practice, an ambassador always is withdrawn when the country to which he is assigned classifies him as unacceptable to it—or persons not grala.

The United States contends that Duvalier is an unconstitutional ruler for staying in office beyond last May 15 when his original constitutional term expired. And it has protested alleged harassment against U.S. diplomats by Duvalier strongmen.

### Negro Gang Beats, Stabs Father of 5

DETROIT (AP)—A white man was stabbed and beaten by a group of Negro youths on the lawn of a high school Friday.

Police said the man, Anthony Duva, 42, quoted the youths, "That's for Louisiana" and "That's for Alabama," while they were punching him.

Duva, who had gone to the school to pick up two daughters, was reported in "temporarily serious" condition at Receiving Hospital from a stab wound in the back.

The incident took place at Chadsey High School on Detroit's west side. The neighborhood, an older part of the city, has both Negro and white residents. Both Negro and white children attend the high school.

Duva, father of five children, said a group of about 10 youths set upon him as he walked toward the front door of the school.

His daughters Joanne, 9, and Annette, 8, had been getting hairdos from students in the school's cosmetology class.

Police said it was not determined whether any of the assailants was a student. Duva said he thought he was stabbed when he fell in shrubbery while trying to get away from the youths.

No arrests were made immediately.

### Paris Backs Reds, Won't Pay to U.N.

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y.—France lined up Friday with the Soviet Union in refusal to accept the General Assembly resolution that all member states must pay assessments for peace-keeping operations.

Like the Soviet Union, the French took the line that only the Security Council could make mandatory decisions.

Roger Seydoux, French permanent representative, also accused the General Assembly of trying to assume the powers of a world government in running peace-keeping operations.

Coupled with similar refusal by the Soviet Union, this indicated that the United Nations faced a basic clash with two of its five permanent Security Council members.

The current special session of the Assembly was called to try to solve difficulties created by the refusal of France, the Soviet Union and some other members to pay assessments for operations which they did not approve.

To date there has been no indication of a solution to the impasse. On June 30 the authority of the secretary general, U Thant, to make disbursements for the operations in the Congo and the Middle East will expire. He has not yet been authorized to pay for those operations for the second half of the year, which are expected to cost \$42,500,000.

FOLLOWS SOVIET  
Seydoux followed the same line Friday as Soviet representatives in the past—that decisions on peace-keeping action and its costs could be made only by the Security Council.

Zenon Rossides of Cyprus took the contrary view. He said that the council had no authority to deal with financial and budgetary matters and that only the General Assembly was competent to deal with the issue.

### Canada's New Tax Perils U.S. Exports

WASHINGTON—Government officials expressed concern Friday that some of the new taxes announced by the Canadian government might hurt American export sales to Canada.

The result could be a worsening of the United States' balance of payments deficit.

Concern here—officially voiced by both State and Treasury departments—focused on proposed changes in Canada's tax treatment of machinery and building materials and the Canadian government's announced intention to reduce its imports on automotive parts from the United States.

Particular concern is in recent years has added hundreds of millions of dollars annually to the American balance of payments deficit. The balance of payments measures the difference between what this country and its citizens spend, lend, invest and give away in other countries and what is taken in from abroad.
