Bobby Del Greco slammed a homer over the left field fence in the second to put Kansas City ahead but Alvis tied it for Cleveland in the third with his 14th home run.

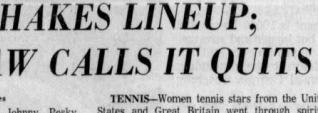
