Fired Revenuers Seize Liquor at Phillips' Home

Former State Revenue Commissioner Glenn Phillips, under fire in the current investigation of an alleged liquor racket, telephoned The Constitution last night that two State revenue agents—whom he discharged when he was in office—raided his home in Harlem, Ga., and confiscated 12 cases of liquor.

He added that liquor would be an "embarrassing subject" for some prospective candidates to discuss. The former Acting Governor sent telegrams to Special State Investigator Claude L. Shaw, Fulton Dist. Gen. Paul Webb, and Atty. Gen. Eugene Cook. He asked "to be given the opportunity to testify as to my official actions as State Revenue Commissioner and as Acting Governor."
