**Dilworth**—First grade pupils who registered last spring will report to their room assignments at 9 a.m. All others will report at 8:45 a.m.

Next in line are the schools. The Legion has always given flags to schools and wants to continue this project.

There's a possibility Congressman Jones can get these flags for the Legion to present to the schools. But there's a little hitch. A flag will require a flag pole and not all the new schools have them.

our organization is to prevent acts of violence," said Patterson. "We are doing our best in spite of constant agitation and inflammatory statements by the NAACP and outside agitators."

The National Assn. for the Advancement of Colored People in a bitter statement following the slaying said "Mississippi has decided to maintain white supremacy by murdering children."

The NAACP also said: "The killers of the boy felt free to lynch him because there is in the entire state no restraining influence of decency, not in the state capital, among the daily newspapers, the clergy nor any segment of the so-called better citizens."

**MOTHER BITTER**  
In Chicago, Till's mother, Mrs. Mamie Bradley, sobbed, "The entire state of Mississippi is going to pay for this."

At Tuskegee, Ala., Tuskegee Institute planned to investigate the Till death together with two other Mississippi slayings which, the famed school said, might be classified as lynchings.

No lynchings have been officially recorded by Tuskegee Institute in its annual report since 1941.

Tentatively listed as lynchings by Tuskegee and still under investigation are the deaths earlier this year in Mississippi of two other Negroes—George W. Lee and La Mar D. Smith.

Both Lee and Smith had been active in seeking to qualify Negroes to vote in Mississippi.

Lee, about 51, was driving his automobile in Belton, Miss., May 7 when fatally wounded by a shotgun blast from another car.

Smith, about 40, was shot to death in August on the lawn of the Lincoln County Court House at Brookhaven.

tive to last June 1 to put Chrysler workers on a par with Ford and GM employees.

**EXPIRES IN 1958**  
The new contract will expire June 1, 1958. This will bring the union's contract negotiations to a head at all "big three" companies at virtually the same time.

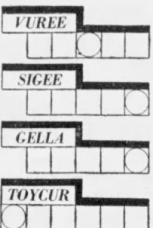
Neither Chrysler nor the UAW would put a specific price tag on the settlement. But Robert W. Conner, a Chrysler vice president, said it would be in proportion with the Ford agreement, which was estimated to cost \$5 million dollars for each of the next three years.

The Ford and GM settlements were labeled as 20-cent an hour "packages" by the UAW.

All three companies had an average hourly wage of about \$2.10 when the current round of negotiations began.

**SEPARATE PLAN**

About 8,000 Chrysler office workers who are UAW members will be covered by a separate layoff pay plan similar to the one which will cover 130,000 Chrysler production workers.

Rose complained to police that an intruder ransacked his kitchen and bedroom and, among

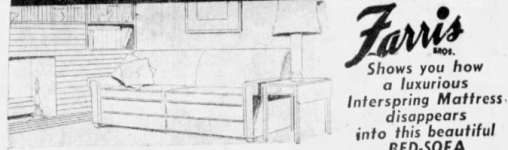
other things, left a container of butter in the middle of the bed. The butter melted and oozed over the covers and into the mattress.

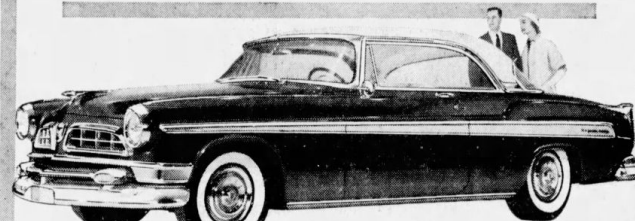
