



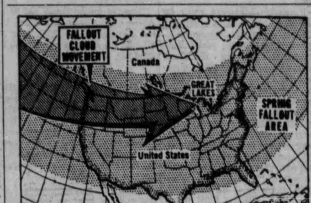

Surrender In Berlin Ruled Out
Rusk Rebuffs Buffer Idea

WASHINGTON (AP)—Secretary of State Dean Rusk Saturday ruled out any agreement to the vital interests of the Western powers or the West Berliners in an effort to come to terms with the Soviet Union on a peaceful Berlin settlement.

Rusk also rebuffed suggestions for creation of a buffer zone in central Europe, including Germany. He said the Communist bloc would seek to use any such neutralized area for "exploitation, expansion, penetration."
