## Brooklyn Leads 5-2 After 3

**BROOKLYN**—Pete Hodges drove a home run into the left field stands with Peewee Reese and Duke Snider on bases in the third inning and sent the Dodgers into a 5-2 lead over the Yankees after three innings of the opening game of the World Series, Hodges by Mickey Robinson of the Yanks and Jackie Robinson of the Dodgers accounted for all but one of the previous runs.

After Bauer grounded out to open the Yankee first inning, Slaughter got a base hit on a grounder near first that Hodges couldn't handle. Mantle then crashed a tremendous home run over the right field screen to put the Yankees ahead 2-0. Berra drew a walk from Maglie but Snider and McDougald went out on strikes.

**YANKEES FIRST:**  
Bauer grounded to Robinson. Slaughter bounced a single off Hodges' glove wide of first base. Mantle hit a home run high over the right field screen into the parking lot across the street, scoring Slaughter ahead of him. Berra walked on a full count. Snider struck out. McDougald went second.

**YANKEES SECOND:**  
Martin fouled to Campanella. Maglie threw a third called strike past Carey. Ford went down swinging.

**YANKEES THIRD:**  
Bauer singled. Slaughter singled. Mantle was called out. Berra popped to Robinson. Snider forced Slaughter.

**DODGERS SECOND:**  
Robinson smashed a line ball down into the lower left field stands. Hodges singled to center. Furlong doubled to left. Snider, scoring Hodges, Campanella walked. Berra and Amoros tied to shallow right center. Maglie struck out.

**DODGERS THIRD:**  
Gilliam popped to McDougald. Reese beat out a hit to deep short. Snider singled. Robinson lined to Mantle. Hodges hit a home run into the lower left field stands, scoring Reese and Snider ahead of him. Furlong flied out.
